# Places of interest in and around Karad



Naktya Ravlyachi Vihir- An ancient step-well in the city itself, located near the Krishna-Koyana pritisangam, this place is known for it's Bhamani style architecture. It makes for a beautiful photography spot.



Krishna-Koyana Pritisangam- This is a popular spot at the confluence of the two iconic rivers- Krishna and Koyana. Late Shri Yashwantrao Chavan's samadhi is a place for peaceful contemplation.



Buddhist Caves of Agashiv- These historic caves from the first century BC are accessible after a short hike up the Agashiv hill. On the way, one can take darshan at the temple of Agashiv at the top.



**Koyana Dam-** This famous structure and hydro-electirc power plant is located about 60 km from Karad and is surrounded by dense forests of the Sahyadri Tiger Reserve.
